Sites of Cultural and Religious Significance

Where it can be established that an indigenous community has a continuing traditional link with land on which the Company intends to conduct activities, the Company will endeavour to identify any sites of special cultural or religious significance and treat these with respect.

Indigenous Employment and Contract Services

In projects that take place on land on or near indigenous communities, the Company will consider employing suitably qualified indigenous persons from that community in positions for which they are competent and willing to fill, and consider providing training programs for these roles where appropriate.
